

Bambi FAQ's

Q: Who owns Bambi Lake?

A: Bambi Lake is the property of the Baptist State Convention of Michigan, so it is "owned" by all Southern Baptists in the state. It is overseen by the Bambi Lake Committee of the Executive Board, BSCM, managed by the on-site Bambi Lake Manager, Cary Shinn, and staffed by dedicated volunteers and paid staff.

Q: Does Bambi just have church events?

A: Bambi primarily hosts events for the Baptist State Convention of Michigan, its associations, churches and individuals. Other groups may have their events hosted at Bambi pending availability and other criteria.

Q: Can I come to Bambi Lake if I'm not attending a conference?

A: Members of Michigan Southern Baptist Churches may stay at Bambi for personal use when rooms or campsites are available. Reservations are required and black-out dates may apply, so call 989-275-5844 in advance.

Camping

The Campgrounds are open Memorial Day through October (weather permitting). Families can camp during conferences or enjoy the campgrounds when on vacation. The campgrounds feature a picnic pavilion, bath house, dock and the Adams Memorial Playground. Firewood and ice are available. (Black out dates apply - reservations are required.)
